How do residential customers sign up for utility assistance relief?

The customer must contact the Low-Income List Administrator ("LILA"). "The residential customer must provide LILA an attestation of unemployment (to be followed by documentation of unemployment within 30 days) and sufficient information to identify the customer's electric service account (e.g., service address, account number, and telephone number)."

Air Conditioning

- 1. The North Texas Air Conditioning Initiative offering FREE air conditioning units for those in need. Criteria to qualify is shown below.
- a. The individual's current residence does not have a functioning air-conditioner, and in your view, they do not have the financial resources to buy one themselves. However, they would have available resources to cover electrical costs for the operation of a window unit air conditioner.
 - b. The individual occupies the residence where a window unit air conditioner could be installed.
 - c. The individual's residence is located 30 miles from downtown Dallas.

PLEASE NOTE: They are unable to install units in apartment complexes. In rental homes, the owner must provide permission in writing before A/C unit can be installed. The actual person requesting the A/C must call to make the request. Although not a requirement, priority should be given to individuals who are elderly, infirmed, or have young children. The individual must agree to be present when the installation occurs.
